Added in 1998 - Deleted in 2001

Reasons of deletion:

The pest appeared in only one publication (Plant Disease 1998) and there was no clear indication that it was a damaging disease. No new information was then made available. In 2001, it was therefore considered that sufficient alert has been given and the pest was deleted from the Alert List.

Why Squash yellow leaf curl virus came to our attention because is was reported for

the first time in 1998 in Oman as a possibly new poty-like virus of courgette

transmitted by Bemisia tabaci.

Possible identity A poty-like virus transmitted by *Bemisia tabaci*. Yellow spots, veinal yellowing and leaf curling.
